Hi Tony,

Lynnda and I listened to a webinar that n4a had yesterday on the potential Sequestration on March 1, 2013.

N4A indicated yesterday that if the sequestration does go through on March 1st (which they think is very likely) that it would be a 10.2% cut for Federal funding that ends on September 30, 2013. This information caused us to look at our internal and flow through funding. We are looking around a \$200,000 cut in funding through September 30, 2013. I did e-mail n4a and asked them if they knew which programs would get the cuts and they did not know. While we have many concerns over sequestration, several of our concerns are:

- ✱ Our Family Caregiver Advocate tries to allocate all of her available funding around May 1, 2013 so that all the funding is allocated and can be spent and all final bills can come in. Should we slow down on FCSP allocations until the March 1st deadline passes? If we do slow down and sequestration does not happen this FFY will we be penalized for not spending all of our funding?
- ✱ Should we instruct our contractors, to not fill slots due to attrition? If they don't fill slots due to attrition and sequestration does not happen in this FFY will they be penalized?

Have you heard anything different from AoA/ACL or NASUAD? I have put this on the State AAA agenda but any kind of guidance or feedback you can give is really appreciated. Thanks! Mary Beth
