The State Auditor presented bids from three electrical contractors for re-wiring and installing new fixtures in the Supreme Court Library. The State Auditor was directed to ascertain whether or not the State Electrician was equipped to do this work, and if it was found that he was not, to advise the Clerk of the Supreme Court to award the contract to Seastrunk Electric Company, Inc., the low bidder, for the sum of \$2,500.00..

A request by the Director of the South Carolina Aeronautics Commission for permission to sell certain old truck equipment, and to use the proceeds of the sale to purchase new similar equipment was approved by the Board.

A letter from Mr. J. Carroll Johnson, Architect, claiming a fee for plans for installing book stacks in the Supreme Court Library was presented to the Board. The Board took the position that since Mr. Johnson is a full-time employee of the University, it was prohibited by law from approving a fee for this work.

The Board authorized the State Forestry Commission to transfer to the State Penitentiary several used pumps which were not needed by the Forestry Commission but were needed at the Penitentiary.

Mr. Bates presented to the Board a statement of the condition of the South Carolina Retirement System. Mr. Bates moved that the matter of electing a Director of the Retirement System should be disposed of at this meeting. After some discussion of the matter, Mr. Rhodes nominated Mr. Tatum Gressette. Mr. Gressette's nomination was seconded by Mr. Brown. All members of the Board except Mr. Bates voted for Mr. Gressette. Mr. Bates voted present. Mr. Bates then moved that the vote be made unanimous, whereupon all members voted for Mr. Gressette. It was agreed that Mr. Gressette should assume the duties of this position on March 1 and the State Auditor was directed to notify him of his election.

The Board then adjourned.

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
