From what I see, this clarified the statute to make it clear that only pipelines that were public utilities and not to a pipeline that was operated by a for-profit company. Thus some natural gas pipelines would be able to use eminent domain because they are a public utility and most are publicly run but petroleum pipelines would not because they are not a public utility and they are for profit.
