

The Budget Commission met in the Ways and Means Committee room, Thursday morning, October 30, 1941, at 9:30, all members being present.

The following departments and institutions appeared before the Commission in connection with their requests for appropriations for the year 1942-43:

A committee of court stenographers also appeared before the Commission and urged that some provision be made to allow travel expense to the court stenographers while engaged on duties away from their official headquarters.


The Commission authorized the Secretary of the Commission on State House and Grounds to purchase flags for the State House and agreed to supply not in excess of \$100.00 for the purchase of same from the Civil Contingent Fund.

I. S. Leevy appeared before the Commission to urge an allotment from the Civil Contingent Fund to help defray the cost of his son's medical education at the Michigan University Medical School. The Secretary was instructed to advise Leevy that the Commission was without authority to grant the allotment from the Civil Contingent Fund but that the matter would be presented to the General Assembly by the Commission.

Mr. C. G. Pike, Auditor of the Tax Commission, presented a request for an allotment from the Civil Contingent Fund to cover the payment of an award to him by the South Carolina Industrial Commission for injuries sustained by him in an automobile accident on May 7, 1941, while on official business. The Secretary was instructed to advise Mr. Pike that the

Commission was without authority to grant this allotment but that the award would be presented to the General Assembly.

The Commission then adjourned.
