What does the Lt. Governor do when he is trying to pass a law?

The LG presides over the Senate. He doesn't file legislation or debate on the Senate floor. He does vote in the case of a tie, but that is rare.

Can he give an example of a proposed law he personally sponsored that was passed into law?

LG Bryant sponsored legislation as a senator to require that a woman receive an ultrasound prior to receiving an abortion. That bill ultimately became law.

What is the process that is required for a law to be proposed, voted on, and enacted?

Bills are proposed by a member and written by legal staff. The bill then receives committee hearings and then goes to the floor for a vote. The bill must be approved by both the House and Senate to become law.

How did the law he personally sponsored that went into law impact the citizens in the community?

The ultrasound bill allows women to give thought to their decision, and ultimately, saves the lives of many, many unborn children.
