WHEREAS, the 2001 observance of "Children's Vision and Learning Month" provides a unique opportunity for the citizens of the Palmetto State to join together to raise public awareness of the importance of vision in the learning process of children.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jim Hodges, Governor of the Great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim August, 2001, as

CHILDREN'S VISION AND LEARNING MONTH

throughout the state and encourage all South Carolinians to recognize the positive impact of early detection and prevention of vision problems on the future educational success of our children.
