I am writing a book on the history of the Haile Gold Mine with the expectation of publishing shortly after the first gold pour at the end of this year. I know that Governor Haley has supported the mine's reopening and worked with its owner OceanaGold and previous owner Romarco Minerals to bring that about.

I would appreciate receiving copies of all press releases and public statements the Governor issued regarding the mine, its owners, its economic impact and the permitting process.

Secondly, could you tell me what action the Governor took, if any, with DHEC and other state agencies during the permitting process, especially early last year when the Sierra Club sought to challenge the permit DHEC had granted.
