A Virginia-based online retailer must pay a commercial activity tax for electronic products it sells in Ohio after a split Ohio Supreme Court ruled Thursday that a common law requirement for retailers to have a physical presence in a state for collecting transaction taxes does not extend to business-privilege taxes.
