March Marks Mayapple Season! Early in March, *Podophyllum peltatum* begin to pop up at Oconee Station State Historic Site. Also known as Mayapple, this plant is known for its white flower which grows between two umbrella-like leaves. Mayapples form dense mats on the forest floor by late March-early April, then bloom a few weeks later. The flower is around for only about two weeks, so bring some luck and bring a camera to capture this beautiful flower.
