South Carolina State Parks According to our park historian: Aiken State Park had its beginnings in the early 1930s when the SC State Commission of Forestry was given charge to build a state park in Aiken County. In August and September of 1934, Aiken County purchased 867 acres of land and donated it to the SC State Commission of Forestry. This land was originally intended to become Aiken State Forest Park. The land and acreage was bought from the following individuals: Murray V. Johnson, J.P. McNair and Wallace D. McNair.
