WHEREAS, responsible growth and development can help ensure that these special cultural resources on land and under state waters are not damaged or destroyed; and

WHEREAS, the South Carolina Institute of Archaeology and Anthropology, Office of the State Archaeologist, the Council of South Carolina Professional Archaeologists, the Archaeological Society of South Carolina, government agencies, museums, libraries, and other organizations, professional and avocational archaeologists, teachers, and private citizens have joined together to foster a sense of pride in protecting our state's archaeological sites.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Nikki R. Haley, Governor of the great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim October 2016 as
