## NEW YEAR'S ADAM

Since Adam came before Eve, we're celebrating New Year's Adam Tuesday night with a drop-in beginning at six. Our suspect intentions are crowded with Bellinis and Manhattans. The Bellinis are made with chilled prosecco and peach nectar, and the Manhattans start with Old Overholt Rye, the Prohibition Era's real deal for medicinal purposes only. In other words, Old Overholt, owned by Secretary of the Treasury Andrew Mellon, was distilled as a street legal solution, or so the story goes.
