Four S.C. Islands still closed from Hurricane / **FOX Carolina**

Gov. Nikki Haley has **requested expedited disaster funding for 13 counties**. Four islands still remain unsafe because of flooding and debris: Hilton Head Island, Fripp Island, Hunting Island and Harbor Island.

- More than 2,000 evacuees are still being held at 43 shelters around the state.
- 1,400 workers from SCDOT are working to get 390 roads and bridges back up and running.
- The S.C. death toll from the storm increased to three.
- Monday morning, 400,000 residents were without power, down from 800,000.
