## Carolina Famous Faces

### **Ben Bernanke** **Born Dec. 13, 1953**

He served as Chairman of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System under both President George W. Bush and President Barack Obama, and presided over one of the most difficult economic periods in recent history. Prior to his appointment, he was Chairman of the President's Council of Economic Advisors and before that served the Federal Reserve System in a number of roles.

Dr. Bernanke also served as a Professor of Economics and Public Affairs at Princeton University. Married with two children, he was born in Augusta, GA, and raised in the small town of Dillon, in northeastern South Carolina. He attended public schools and according to some reports, earned money before and during college by working at South of the Border, a popular "highway oasis" along Interstate 95. Some reports suggest that he attained the highest SAT score in South Carolina in the year he graduated from high school.

Dr. Bernanke received his B.A. in economics in 1975 from Harvard (summa cum laude) and a Ph.D. in economics in 1979 from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Today, he's a distinguished fellow in residence with the economic studies program at the Brookings Institution, affiliated with the Hutchins Center on Fiscal and Monetary Policy, which will bring rigorous research analysis to critical questions in vital areas of economic policy.

In 2015 he published *The Courage to Act*, a memoir of his experiences with the Federal Reserve, including his discussion of

Located somewhat north of Hillsborough, NC, Boxcarr is the culmination of a mix of talented and committed individuals who settled here to create their cheesy goodness. Co-founders (and brother and sister) Austin and Samantha Genke have influences that span the East Coast, from Florida to New Jersey.

Samantha Genke moved to North Carolina and for the next decade, worked in creameries and learned from some of the best in the business. Austin Genke graduated from the Culinary Institute of America, and for a time, worked in Las Vegas at both the MGM Grand and the Venetian.

In North Carolina, the siblings farm 30 acres, run a food truck and catering business, and have developed an amazing group of cheeses. Today, they continue to draw from their Italian-American roots and are raising their respective families on the farm.
