TIDBIT! Ruby-crowned Kinglets are fast-moving little birds that you might overlook at first. This winter resident in the Southeast, at first appears as any other small olive-gray bird moving frantically throughout the limbs of trees as it feeds. Suddenly, the male is alarmed or is trying to attract a female he pulls back the feathers on his crown displaying the brilliant red feathers that gives the bird its common name. Don't rely on seeing this bird's ruby crown—it's often kept completely hidden.
