Mr. Poore called the meeting to order and Councilman Gerrard gave the invocation.

On the motion of Mr. Hooper, seconded by Mr. Wiles, Council voted unanimously to approve the minutes of the October 2, 1979, meeting as mailed.

Mrs. Linda Dickerson discussed a need for speed breakers on Hickory Lane. The County attorney, Robert P. Lusk, advised Mrs. Dickerson that if it's in the authority of Anderson County Council as far as public health and safety is concerned they could put the speed breakers up, but he stated that he had to research the matter and make a recommendation to Council at its next meeting. However, he would respond directly to her on Friday (10-19-79). He assured Mrs. Dickerson that he would talk with Sheriff Cooley about patrolling the area.

Mr. Robert Gamble appeared before Council representing the heirs of Winston C. Sherard. Mr. Winston C. Sherard died in 1966. The family requested that the South Carolina Highway #S4555 be known as Simpson-Sherard Road or Drive. This road #S4555 runs between 187-181; one end owned by Ms. Sarah Simpson and the other end by Mr. Sherard. Duke Power Company is the only other property owner involved and they go along with the change. Mr. Gamble also asked Councilman Wiles to investigate the status of an old county dirt road that runs thru the property and goes to the Duke Power property and Savannah River. He asked that this dirt road described as a lovers lane be closed. Mr. Wiles told Mr. Gamble that he would check out the matter and report the status to him.

Mr. Robert Gamble also appeared before Council asking for \$11,000 to replace former PSE employees for the Youth Home. Mr. Whitfield, Director of the Youth Home, discussed the needs with Council. Mr. Poore received as information.

Mr. Trey Senn, Director of the Planning & Development Board, asked Council to name Mr. William A. Everly, Mr. James Tinsley, and Mr. Joe F. Brandt to the Housing Board of Adjustments & Appeals in Morningside Community. On the motion of Mr. Gerrard, seconded by Mr. Hooper, Council voted unanimously to accept the three as proposed.

Mr. J. David Watson presented sealed bids for asphalt picked up at the plant. On the motion of Mr. Rhodes, seconded by Mr. Wiles, Council voted unanimously to award the bid to Tribble Construction Company with the low bid of \$17.15 per ton.

Mr. Watson also read a letter from Mr. Danny Farmer with the Chamber of Commerce concerning "We're Proud of Anderson" campaign. On the motion of Mr. Wright, seconded by Mr. Hooper, Council voted unanimously to direct the County Attorney to draw up a resolution regarding the subject.

Mr. Mac Walters, County Engineer, asked Council to accept into the County system Ryder Road, Regency Park and Gary McAlister Road. On the motion of Mr. Hooper, seconded by Mr. Gerrard, Council voted unanimously to accept these roads into the County system.

Mr. Ray Sanders, representing his community, presented a drawing to the County Engineer concerning Lakewood Lane, Pioneer Lane, and Graham Road. He suggested that getting rid of the 3 road combination and removing the existing Pioneer Lane where you would have a "T" intersection and re-routing to where there would be another "T" intersection would eliminate the hazardous condition. Mr. Walters was directed by Mr. Poore to check out the drawing and make a study and report back to Council.

On the motion of Mr. Hooper, seconded by Mr. Rhodes, Council voted unanimously to adjourn at 7:55 p.m.
