Dear Long Term Care (LTC) Leaders,

I am making contact today to let you know about a great opportunity to partner for the first time with the South Carolina Hospital Association (SCHA) in a national collaboration to improve care for our patients.

As you know, SCHA is a professional association that supports all South Carolina member hospitals with their legislative, educational and staffing needs, in addition to patient safety and quality care resources. We work with our hospitals on several national, regional, statewide, and even local projects designed to improve patient care delivery and reduce harm to patients. Now, we have an opportunity to collaborate with you, our statewide Long Term Care facilities, on the AHRQ national implementation of a Comprehensive Unit-based Safety Program (CUSP) to reduce Catheter- associated Urinary Tract Infections (CAUTI) and other infections in LTC facilities. Urinary tract and other avoidable infections contribute to re-hospitalizations, additional care and even death for South Carolina LTC facility residents. We would like to help!

In partnership with SCHA and the national program, we will provide your facility and your entire care team with a safety program focused on reducing facility-acquired infections, improving unit communications, developing processes and support for infection prevention activities.

The program is **free** and SCHA will coordinate all the activities of the project for you. In addition, we are offering on-site training, visits and team interactions which will be customized to each facility.
