Dear Chairman Leatherman,

As you are aware, I unveiled my agenda for infrastructure and economic development in my State of the State Address in January. The cornerstone of this agenda is a proposal that decreases individual income tax rates by two percentage points to put money back into the pockets of taxpayers, allows for a ten cent increase in gas taxes to fund our roads, and restructures the Department of Transportation (DOT) to give the Secretary of that agency one clear line of accountability. I understand that you have organized a subcommittee to address this issue and that the full Senate Finance Committee will be considering S.523, a bill which addresses transportation funding and an income tax cut and repeals the sunset provision in Act 114 of 2007 allowing the current DOT governance to continue.

While I appreciate the work done by you, Senator Cleary and other members of the Senate Finance Committee on transportation funding, **this bill, as it stands, is a massive tax increase on the citizens of South Carolina** and does not address the fundamental governance flaws responsible for so much of DOT's current dysfunction. **Further, the current income tax cut proposal in S. 523 is insufficient, and I would veto this bill if it came to my desk today.** I urge you, as I have your counterparts in the House of Representatives, to put forth a plan that does not result in tax increases to the people. Rather, it is our responsibility to forgo at least some future growth of government and return hard-earned wages back to the people who earned them.

As always, my door is open to discuss this or any other matter with you.
