WHEREAS, the 2016 observance of Kidney Disease Awareness Month helps raise awareness of chronic kidney disease and its risk factors.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Nikki R. Haley, Governor of the great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim March 2016 as
