#### Description/Significant Features:

Inland swamp rice field in 4 mile long drainage of Newton Creek. Creek is in Ashley River watershed. Remains of dams, facing ditches and banks, causeways, canals and field squares. Dams have an 8-10 base and are 2-4 foot above grade, perpendicular to water flow. They have corresponding ditches that are 1-3 feet below grade. Facing banks similar in size but are parallel to water flow and also have corresponding ditches. Embankments become larger in the northwest corner of the system with banks being 10-15 feet base.

## **Historical Information**

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Remains located in Newton Creek drainage inside eastern Watson Hill Tract. Features are associated with Wragg's Riverside Plantation (a part of Wragg's Barony), Haggett Hall Plantation, Gadsden's Plantation, and Wampee Savanna Plantation. All represent early eighteenth century inland swamp rice fields.
