To this end, the topics Norah's team anticipates covering are as follows:

- The governor's background and how she got to where she is today as the first female and minority governor of South Carolina.
- The significance of being the first female and minority governor of the state, what kinds of challenges she has faced over the course of her career in elected office, etc.
- Life as a military wife and mom, whose husband was deployed, in addition to being the governor.
- The importance/significance of the governor to the presidential primary process in 2016. Role the governor could play in the presidential campaign. Role the governor could play in the future of the Republican Party. Role the governor could play in a Republican administration.
- The importance/significance of South Carolina in the presidential primary process.
- Women's issues and their significance in 2016. Particularly in the context of Hillary Clinton's candidacy.
- Republican candidates who are already officially in the race for president: Ted Cruz, Rand Paul, Marco Rubio. Issues they have talked about. Their viability. Their appeal in South Carolina and problems they could encounter. Their relationships with the governor.
- Republican candidates who are likely to run. Same topics as those who haven't jumped in. Our relationships with them. Could also get a Lindsey Graham question here.
- Walter Scott's shooting and its aftermath, including its significance in the context of officer-involved shootings around the country.
- The governor's fights against unions. This is a topic they have repeatedly mentioned as an issue the governor is identified with nationally.
- Focus on economic development.
