See our [update](#) on enrollment across SBMs. As states head toward the finish line of open enrollment they continue to increase their efforts to enroll individuals in coverage,

including targeted outreach to the hard-to-reach as well as a ramp up of community events and in-person support. The Department of Health and Human Services has recently released an [enrollment update](#), citing that over 11.2 million individuals have enrolled in plans through the marketplace, 2.7 million of which have come through the 13 states operating as State-based Marketplaces (SBMs).
