**BACKGROUND**

3M COMPANY

HISTORY

3M Company (3M) was founded in 1902 as Minnesota Mining and Manufacturing Company by five

businessmen to mine minerals in northern Minnesota. The mine failed, but the

company survived.

#### FINANCIALS

3M had sales of \$26.7 billion in 2010, up more than 15 percent from 2009, and ranked No.

97 on the 2011 Fortune 500 list of largest companies in the U.S. based on revenue.

Operations outside of the U.S. represent about two-thirds of company sales.

3M is one of 30 companies in the Dow Jones Industrial Average and is a component of the

Standard & Poor's 500.

3M has more than 80,000 employees, with 33,000 in the U.S. and 47,000 employed internationally.

#### BUSINESS DESCRIPTION

3M is a diversified global technology company that makes more than 55,000 products. Its

businesses are organized in six segments: Consumer and Office; Display and Graphics; Electro and Communications; Healthcare; Industrial and Transportation and Safety, Security and Protection Services.

3M makes a range of products for the transportation market. Its Industrial and Transportation division is its largest and makes an assortment of tapes, films, high-quality abrasives, adhesives and specialty materials used in the aerospace, automotive, marine and specialty vehicles industries. 3M products are used in designing, manufacturing, maintaining and repairing automobiles, aircraft, boats and recreational vehicles.

Essentially, 3M is a science company, developing and applying technologies in new ways. In

2010, 3M spent more than \$1.4 billion on R&D and employed more than 7,000 researchers

working in 45 technology areas, including adhesives, abrasives, light management, microreplication, nonwoven materials, nanotechnology and surface modification. The company regularly churns out inventions and has almost 600 U.S. patents.

3M also operates 3M New Ventures which identifies and invests in new technologies in seven strategic areas – Architecture, Lighting and Living; Mobility Solutions; Communications; Healthcare; Renewable Energy and Water, Safety and Security. Scotch® and Post-It® (now including digital Post-Its) are two of 3M's famous consumer brands, but the company has numerous products ubiquitous to the chemical, construction, healthcare, security and many other industries. For example, its reflective films increase the brightness of LCD screens on television sets and cell phones, and its touchscreen

technology  
is used in the foodservice, industrial, healthcare and retail fields. Plus, many 3M products are multi-purpose. Vinyl electrical tape, which 3M invented 65 years ago, has been improved numerous times and is used in many applications – not just for electrical purposes.

Each year 3M receives numerous recognitions for innovation, its workplace environment, sustainability and its products. In June, 3M received the Freedom Award, the highest recognition given by the U.S. Department of Defense to companies that provide “exceptional support” to their employees serving in the National Guard and Reserve. There are 15 national winners each year.

The guiding management principles for 3M originated with William L. McKnight, who served as 3M chairman from 1949 to 1966. He encouraged 3M management to "delegate responsibility and encourage men and women to exercise their initiative."

Every 3M makes a number of acquisitions. In January 2012, 3M entered into an agreement to buy the office and consumer products business of Avery Dennison Corporation, expanding 3M's portfolio of consumer brands to include Avery, HI-LITERS and others. Avery Dennison has a plant in Clinton that prints U.S. postage stamps and labels and tags for radio frequency identification technology which is not included in the sale.

#### **BUSINESS OPERATIONS**

3M is headquartered in St. Paul, Minnesota, and has operations in more than 60 countries.

The St. Paul headquarters has about 10,000 employees and is also the location of the company's corporate research laboratories and certain division laboratories.

3M has 76 manufacturing facilities in 28 states and 155 manufacturing and converting facilities in 38 countries plus 30 lab sites outside of the U.S. Between 2003 and 2008, 3M closed about 50 manufacturing plants worldwide.

3M's chairman, president and CEO, George W. Buckley, is scheduled to step down in February when he turns 65.

#### **SOUTH CAROLINA OPERATIONS**

3M Greenville consists of two manufacturing operations, a film plant and a tape plant, with approximately 500 employees on a 100-acre site in the South Carolina Technology and Aviation Center. Greenville's products include optical films, transparencies, release

liners and  
box sealing tapes.

The Film Plant is part of 3M's Display and Graphics segment and produces a wide variety of polyester films which are used in many 3M products across several divisions of the company. The plant also includes a sheet converting operation for manufacturing high-quality transparency products. Olin Corporation opened the plant in 1971, and 3M acquired it in 1974.

The Film Plant had major expansions in 1982 and 1983 that doubled the size of the plant by adding 125,000 square feet. In 2006, 3M picked Greenville for a competitive, \$100 million expansion of the plant. Greenville County approved a six percent fee in lieu of property tax arrangement for the project.

The Tape Plant is part of 3M's Industrial and Transportation segment and produces box sealing tapes and polypropylene films. These films are used as backings for box sealing tapes and other commercial 3M products.

3M opened the Tape Plant in 1976. In 1983, converting operations were added; and, in 1991, 3M moved box sealing tape production to Greenville from Bristol, Pennsylvania. At the time, 3M said that its location in Greenville was more cost competitive. In 2001, 3M transferred filament tape production to Greenville from Bristol. The product move included an investment of \$18.4 million.

3M Greenville uses an environmental management system to manage the environmental footprint of its operations. Since 1975, 3M Greenville has completed 73 3P (pollution prevention pays) projects that prevented more than 28,700 tons of air pollution, 328 tons of water pollution and 13,635 tons of waste. In 1999, 3M Greenville was one of the company's first large manufacturing sites to receive ISO 14001 certification for environmental management.

In 2011, 3M was among the sponsors of the Summit on STEM Education in Greenville and also participated in a Greenville Manufacturers Expo to educate students on manufacturing careers.

3M's community giving consists of gifts by the company and its foundation. In 2010, the 3M

Foundation donated \$20,000 to the Lake Conestee Nature Park for a nature education program. The park is a National Audubon Society-designated Important Bird Area of Global

Significance and consists of 400 acres on the Reedy River six miles from downtown Greenville. Michelin and the Jolley Foundation also contributed to the project.

Also in 2010 (the most recent information available), the foundation made numerous gifts to

South Carolina organizations, including The Children's Museum of the Upstate, Trees Greenville Inc., Junior Achievement of Upstate SC and other groups and schools.

In 2007, 3M gave Clemson University a modified chemical vapor deposition lathe worth about \$900,000 to fabricate optical fibers on an industrial level. At the time, it made Clemson the only university in the U.S. and one of the few in the world to have that capability.

Joseph T. Bailey, formerly vice president for research and development for 3M's industrial

and consumer sectors, is a graduate of Clemson and serves on the board of the Clemson

University Research Foundation.
