SC Park Rangers I want to comment about fees in South Carolina State Parks. Should parks be accessible to everyone? Yes! Should they be free? No. Because no park is truly free. Someone is paying for it in one way or another. Should they be affordable, as best that they possibly can. When you add up eight dollars per person for say 5 people, that's \$40 in one trip. That can hurt. But when you look at the \$99 Passport, that on frontside seems high until you break it down. The pass is good for 365 or maybe a little more depending on when you buy it. That's 27 cents a day, I know people that won't even bend over to pickup 27 cents they find on the ground, free money. OR look at another way, that's \$8.25 a month. If I pay the \$99 (\$8.25 a day) I can go by myself or with 4 other people and its still the same cost. People pay that much every single month year after year for their Netflix and Hulu and don't think twice about it. Every dollar I spend on a state park stays in state parks, therefore I am supporting every state park in South Carolina. The best deal, the best resources and the best people can be found inside a SC State Park.
