

The 76 year old lodge at Table Rock State Park is a prime example of skilled craftsmanship. The lodge was built in 1935 by the Civilian Conservation Corps using native stone and timber. After functioning as a restaurant until 2002, the building was renovated to display more of its original rustic look. The lodge can be rented for weddings or other events, providing a grand setting with interior character and a stunning background of mountain landscape. Historic integrity has been preserved while serving thousands of visitors each year.
