Dear Ms. Geddis:

Thank you for writing this agency regarding the upcoming Medicaid reductions and eliminations. We appreciate you bringing your concerns to our attention.

Determining which programs and services to reduce during such difficult times is always challenging. We deeply regret the impact that the reductions and eliminations may have on Medicaid beneficiaries. Unfortunately, we are forced to reduce and eliminate optional services so that we may continue to offer the core services that so many Medicaid beneficiaries depend on. After further review, several service reductions were reversed. Please refer to the attached news release for additional information. Individuals with certain medical conditions who require "medically necessary" services may be eligible to continue to receive some of the reduced services; however, their medical provider must make a special request in writing for review by the Medicaid agency's Medical Directors.

Regarding enrollment, the new federal healthcare reform law, and previously the stimulus package, prohibits the South Carolina Department of Health and Human Services from changing any eligibility policy that would result in enrollment reductions. The eligibility guidelines listed below have not changed as a result of budget constraints.

To qualify for Medicaid benefits, an individual must meet certain state and federal financial guidelines, non-financial requirements and fit into one of the categories listed below:

- Individual receiving cash assistance such as Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Individual age 65 or older, blind or disabled (as defined by the Social Security Administration)
- Child under age 19
- Pregnant woman
- Family with a dependent child(ren)
- Woman diagnosed and found in need of treatment for breast and/or cervical cancer
- Individual qualifying for family planning services only

Although you are awaiting a decision from the Social Security Administration (SSA) regarding your disability benefits, you may apply for Medicaid; however, since Medicaid uses the same disability guidelines as the SSA, we must await their disability decision before making a Medicaid eligibility decision. If you meet all eligibility guidelines, you may be eligible to receive Medicaid coverage for up to three months prior to the date we receive your application. Enclosed is a *Medicaid Overview* along with an application. 
The Federal Government recently passed the *Affordable Care Act* that will make substantive changes to Medicaid's eligibility requirements; however, these changes will not take place until calendar year 2014. Already in place this year is the new "Pre-Existing Condition Insurance Plan" overseen by the US Department of Health and Human Services. To find out more about this plan or to apply for its coverage, please call 1-866-717-5826.

At the state level, the South Carolina Department of Insurance offers health insurance coverage to residents with pre-existing medical conditions who are considered "high risk" through the SC Health Insurance Pool. To find out more about the insurance pool coverage and rates, please call Blue Cross/Blue Shield of SC at 1-800-868-2500, Ext. 46401.

An alternate health insurance option called *Augeo Benefits* offers a variety of health insurance plans from top-rated insurance carriers at *affordable* rates. These plans include major medical, basic medical, critical illness and dental. Some plans are available regardless of pre-existing conditions.
