Greetings from Minnesota.

Like those of you in South Carolina and people all over our United States, I was shocked by the tragic murders of nine people at a Bible study at their church in Charleston last week. It is very hard to understand how South Carolinians can adore the Confederate flag and all it stands for while still calling themselves patriotic Americans. Are we one country or not?

It was shocking for me to learn that the Confederate flag, with its place of honor on statehouse

grounds, cannot be moved without a 2/3 vote of both houses of the legislature. Thus it is treated as more sacred, more special, than the flag of the U.S. and the flag of South Carolina. That is a slap in the face to the rest of us. Are we one country or not? Are we stuck in the sorry past or living in the present and working to build a better future?

I'm sorry to have to say it, but I feel I cannot in good conscience go to South Carolina for any reason until the Confederate flag is removed from its place on official state property. It is hurtful to many citizens of your state and it is offensive to many others. While South Carolina has many places worth visiting, I cannot support with my travel dollars a place that spits on the the values of justice and equality, but prefers to remain stuck glorifying a past of hate and injustice.

Please work tirelessly to have the Confederate flag removed from any official government site in South Carolina. The world is watching you.

Dear Honorable Haley,

I am writing to you this evening to express my disgust with your decision to call for the removal of the Confederate flag from the state capitol. I am currently in the final stages of completing my Ph.D. dissertation in nineteenth century southern history which centers on the South Carolina government during the Civil War. There is no question that the Confederacy fought for the preservation of slavery. Nor is there any question that the Confederate battle flag is divisive. But this is not an adequate reason for the removal of the flag. The overwhelming majority of Americans in the nineteenth century, including those from the North, were considered racists by our standards of today. South Carolinians fought for the preservation of their society, which happened to be a slaveholding society. Yet over 300,000 southerners died in the Civil War fighting for the Confederacy. We cannot honor them by flying the American flag since that is precisely the flag they fought against. The best way to honor the Confederate dead is to either fly the Battle Flag or the First National (Stars and Bars) flag. We owe it to those who sacrificed their lives to fly the flag of their country, which was the Confederate States of America. I believe you are removing this flag purely for political reasons or due to political pressure. I cannot accept such cowardice from our public officials. I urge you to keep the Confederate Flag flying proudly in front of the state house. History dictates we remember the past, and by lowering the flag we are

only sinking further into ignorance. If anything, the Confederate Flag should continue to fly in front of the state house as reminder of our past mistakes, and to ensure that we do not repeat those mistakes. You are unfortunately making a serious mistake calling for the removal of a flag under which so many died gloriously in battle for. I hope you reconsider this poor politically charged decision based on the actions of one person who is clearly not representative of the majority who fly the Confederate Flag proudly.

Will the real Confederate Flag please stand up?

When one usually thinks of the Confederate flag this usually comes to mind, a flag with a red banner, crisscrossed with with blue stripes and white stars. This images usually evokes very strong emotions, for some it is a symbol of racism and hatred. For others it is a symbol of southern pride and heritage. While for others it can be a symbol of rebellion. However, during the American Civil War, this was one of many flags that was used to symbolize the Confederacy, and in fact a wide variety of flags and banners were used by Confederate forces. The Confederacy was exactly what it was named after, a Confederacy (which is a loose union of independent states). As a result each was almost like its own independent nation, and chose their own Confederate flags to take into battle.

The Official Flag, the Stars and Bars

Unbeknownst to many today, this was the official flag of the Confederacy through most of the

Civil War. At first it was the exclusive flag carried into battle by Confederate forces. However there was a problem with this. It resembled the Union Stars and Stripes flag so much that it was not uncommon for it to cause confusion and even friendly fire incidents on the battlefield. As a result each Confederate state was encouraged to create their own battle flag. The Stars and Bars, meanwhile, would only be used in government buildings and courts. Quizzically it had 13 stars representing 13 states, however only 11 states succeeded from the Union. The other two represent Kentucky and Missouri, which were states that were officially part of the Union, but unofficially were under dispute during the Civil War.

The Flag of the Army of Northern Virginia,

Now this more resembles that stereotypical Confederate Flag. However, this was not the official Confederate flag, rather it was the battle flag of the Army of Northern Virginia. While initially used by Virginia, eventually this flag would become popular with other states as well, especially Tennessee, which adopted it as their official battle flag, with the modification of using a rectangular shaped flag rather than a square banner.

The Bonnie Blue Flag

A single star on a blue banner, the Bonnie Blue Flag was introduced in Florida around 1810 when a part of West Florida broke away with Spanish Florida. This flag would become popular with the states of the deep south such as Florida, Georgia, Alabama, Mississippi, and Texas.

The Louisiana Confederate Flag

Louisiana decided that it would keep the stars and stripes pattern except with a bit of a twist.

The South Carolina Confederate Flag

South Carolina also decided to create their own unique design.

The Second and Third Official Confederate Flag

In 1863 a new official Confederate Flag was adopted to replace the stars and bars. It feature a large white banner with the Virginia Battle Flag placed in the Union. The occurred for three big reasons; 1. the Virginia Battle Flag was becoming popular 2. Virginia was gaining more influence in Confederate politics. 3. As Union forces took control of the Mississippi and began carving up the Confederacy, Virginia was becoming more isolated from the rest of the country. Since the capitol was in Virginia, Virginians were taking control of "official" Confederate matters.

The new flag also had it problems, chiefly that the large white banner was often mistaken for a flag of truce, especially at sea. As a result, in march of 1865, a large red vertical strip was added. The war would end a month later.

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Greetings from Minnesota.

Like those of you in South Carolina and people all over our United States, I was shocked by the tragic murders of nine people at a Bible study at their church in Charleston last week. It is clear that they were targeted because of their race. The killer's affection for the Confederate flag and other symbols of white supremacy, as well as his own words, make it plain that he glorified the sins of our past including slavery and Jim Crow, and intended by his cruelty to ignite a race-based war.

It is long past time for South Carolinians to rethink their romanticization of the slave-era South and the Confederate flag.

For me, a white American woman, the Confederate flag is highly offensive for two main reasons. First, it symbolizes the sin of slavery--a system of oppression, rapes, beatings, dividing families and severe economic exploitation based on race. Secondly, it is the symbol for a group of traitors who went to war against our own United States and sought to break up our nation. It is very hard to understand how South Carolinians can adore the Confederate flag and all it stands for while still calling themselves patriotic Americans. Are we one country or not?

It was shocking for me to learn that the Confederate flag, with its place of honor on statehouse grounds, cannot be moved without a 2/3 vote of both houses of the legislature. Thus it is treated as more sacred, more special, than the flag of the U.S. and the flag of South Carolina. That is a slap in the face to the rest of us. Are we one country or not? Are we stuck in the sorry past or living in the present and working to build a better future?

I'm sorry to have to say it, but I feel I cannot in good conscience go to South Carolina for any reason until the Confederate flag is removed from its place on official state property. It is hurtful to many citizens of your state and it is offensive to many others. While South Carolina has many places worth visiting, I cannot support with my travel dollars a place that spits on the the values of justice and equality, but prefers to remain stuck glorifying a past of hate and injustice.

Please work tirelessly to have the Confederate flag removed from any official government site in South Carolina. The world is watching you.

discrimination and be the God loving, Christian, welcoming, neighbors that we need to be and that we owe our fellow South Carolina citizens.

Finally, when the flag was removed from the State House, the symbol of representative government in S.C., which the Federals tried to burn, you and the legislature said it would be secure there. That was a lie. You claim to fight against incrementalism. What is next . Wade Hampton's Statue, or maybe all the confederate memorial monuments across the state, erected mostly by women, unlike you , faithful to the fathers and husbands and brothers of this state who fought to depend its reputation and security. By your catering to the perception instead of educating you have placed resentment in white South Carolinians who are proud of their ancestors and this has the potential to create a rift as they then blame Black South Carolinians perception for the resulting defaming of their family.
