I am writing for two reasons. First, I thank you and your staff for providing data for our June 2006 Medicaid enrollment update report that Eileen Ellis and David Rousseau prepare for *The Kaiser Commission on Medicaid and the Uninsured*. The final June 2005 report is available at: www.kff.org and we expect that the June 2006 report will be available at the June NASMID meeting.

Second, we are now preparing our next report, which will focus on trends in Medicaid enrollment through December 2006 in all 50 states and the District of Columbia. For that report, we are now asking that you send us a copy of your data, such as the report that you normally use for administrative purposes, that shows Medicaid enrollment by eligibility category for the month of December 2006.

We are also asking you to assist us with a special effort to split the Medicaid enrollment between children and adults for as many states as possible beginning with the June 2006 data if at all possible. Ideally the count of children would only include those enrolled in children's eligibility groups and not disabled children.

We will continue to track trends in enrollment of other subsets of the Medicaid population including the following: (1) families, children, and pregnant women; (2) aged and disabled; (3) "childless adults" for those states with waivers; (4) Transitional Medical Assistance; (5) poverty-related (SOBRA) enrollment within the "families, children and pregnant women" group; (6) family planning waivers; and (7) Pharmacy Plus Waivers.

June 15 is our collection deadline for these data. Many states now provide the information electronically.
