Archaeologists digging up history, guided historic tours of the 250 year old fort, and musket fire by Revolutionary War period re-enactors — these are just some of the activities during *Colonial Dorchester: Under the Crescent*.

Watch as members of the 2nd South Carolina Regiment re-create experiences of South Carolina's Continental soldiers such as firing muskets, conducting military drills, cooking, and camp-life. Due to the noise of musket firing, visitors are asked to leave pets at home.

Events are scheduled Saturday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Sunday 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Admission fees: \$2 for ages 15 and up, and \$1.25 for SC seniors, and free for children 14 and under.

Colonial Dorchester is an archaeological treasure that rests on the site of Dorchester, a trading town that flourished along the Ashley River, inland from Charleston, from 1687 through the Revolutionary War.
