Thinking Forward to Create Smart Cities

Charter is committed to partnering with communities to power smart cities and we have invested billions of dollars to build the network and have the operational scale to enable them. Our investments have enabled 840,000 miles of network infrastructure, more than 350,000 Spectrum Wifi hotspots and the ability to deliver up to 100 Gbps symmetrical speeds to businesses. Our Enterprise business alone is investing more than \$1 billion for new fiber infrastructure in 2018 and is connecting over 50 buildings a day to our fiber network.

But building a smart city is more than just sensors, software and connectivity. We recently hosted an event in our “Think Forward” event series about building smart cities. At the event, FCC Commissioner Michael O’Rielly, Mayor Stephen Benjamin of Columbia, South Carolina, who is also serving as the President of the U.S. Conference of Mayors, and a panel of experts discussed how we can use technology to make our communities more efficient and effective.

Mayor Benjamin [identified public-private partnerships](#) as a promising means of making smart cities a reality for cities and communities across the country; “We are strong advocates of public-private partnerships, we are strong

advocates of working together to make sure that our citizens can live up to their God-given potential in our cities.”
