State Fuel Tax Revenues Up in 2014

In 2014, slightly less than 5 percent of state tax revenue, or \$41.5 billion, came from fuel taxes, according to the U.S. Census Bureau's 2014 Annual Survey of State Government Tax Collections. Just 1.3 percent of Alaska's tax revenue came from fuel taxes--the lowest percentage among states--compared to 8.6 percent in South Dakota.


