- WHEREAS,** since the beginning of the crime victims' rights movement, partnerships have formed among criminal and juvenile justice agencies, allied professionals, victim services, and the private sector to ensure that crime victims are treated with the fairness, dignity, and respect they deserve; and
- WHEREAS,** victim assistance organizations and crime victim advocates throughout South Carolina and the nation are dedicated to providing assistance, support, and comfort to victims while ensuring that their rights are protected; and
- WHEREAS,** individuals, neighborhoods, and communities across our state and nation gain strength and power by uniting against crime and for victims' rights and services; and
- WHEREAS,** with the theme, *30 Years: Restoring the Balance of Justice*, South Carolina Victims' Rights Week serves as a reminder of the progress that has been made on behalf of crime victims since the passage of the Victims of Crime Act in 1984 as well as the vital importance of ensuring victims' rights on all levels and in every case.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Nikki R. Haley, Governor of the Great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim May 11 - 17, 2014, as
