Subject: Call your US Rep about National Lifespan Respite Care Act

The National Respite Network needs you to call your U.S. Representative today or Thursday. *Ask him to sign on to the Langevin/Harper "Dear Colleague" letter to Congressional appropriators requesting \$5 million for the Lifespan Respite Care Program in FY 2018.* No S.C. legislator has signed on yet. The deadline for House members to sign is Friday, 3/31.

Why should YOU care?

South Carolina received one of the first twelve Lifespan Respite Care Grants in 2009, and it was a key factor in us securing state funding earmarked for respite from the S.C. Legislature. Now we have \$2 million a year as a recurring line item in the Lt. Governor's budget, as well as a solid stream of funding of over \$774,000 from the state for Alzheimer's respite.

NOTE: The total amount for the entire USA in the Lifespan Respite Care Act is only \$2.6 million, while we now have almost \$3 million going directly to families in the form of vouchers. This request is for the amount in next year's federal budget to be raised to \$5 million – FOR THE WHOLE COUNTRY!
