

November 10, 1942.

The Budget Commission met in the Senate Finance Committee Room at 10:00 o'clock A. M. on November 10, 1942, all members being present.

The following departments and institutions appeared in behalf of their requests for 1943-44 appropriations:

- The South Carolina Tax Commission
- The State Forestry Commission
- The Chief Game Warden
- The Department of Public Welfare
- The Confederate Relic Room
- The Joint Committee on Printing
- Clemson College

The Commission then recessed until 3:00 o'clock, and at that time met and heard the following departments and institutions:

- The State Planning Board
- The South Carolina Aeronautics Commission
- The South Carolina Industrial Commission
- The South Carolina Historical Commission

Representatives of the South Carolina Industries Committee, Inc., appeared before the Commission, and urged that the corporation franchise taxes be reduced.

Approximately seventy municipal officials, representing the Municipal Association of South Carolina, appeared before the Commission and urged that certain fees and revenues of the State, including the tax on alcoholic liquors, and motor transport fees, be reallocated so as to give to the municipalities of the State a larger proportion of these fees and revenue.
