Anderson DSS tells us that no facility is available in S.C. that can serve his needs.

Glenn has been placed in 5 (five) different facilities in the last 8 months. What is going on with S.C. that we can not take care of our citizens,

Our family is at a dead-end on what to do. We want Glenn closer to his family. He needs that love from us. As Gov. Haley says, "It's A Great Day In South Carolina". We don't find this to be true. S.C. wants to take care of illegal immigrants, but we can't take care of our own S.C. citizens.

We want the best possible care for all in S.C. including Glenn. Please check into our heart-felt concerns. We appreciate everything that you can do for us.
