The county did not report the incident to EMD, and Stenson believes that the City of Charleston and/or City of Mt. Pleasant might not have even notified the county -- being that the bridge is controlled by the two municipalities. Because EMD relies on the locals to report incidents, and because in this case, no state assistance was requested, EMD didn't know until they received information about the spill and closure from the National Response Center (under DHS), which is a standard national reporting system. I talked with Stenson tonight about the need for a heads-up on these types of significant local incidents that result in news coverage, and he said they'll try to monitor local issues better.
