December 1, 1952

A meeting of the State Budget and Control Board, Division of Sinking Funds and Property, was held in the office of the Governor on Monday, December 1, 1952. All members were present.

Trial Balances of June 30, 1952, July 31, 1952, August 31, 1952, September 30, 1952, and October 31, 1952, (of the several Sinking Funds) were presented and received as information.

Action on offer of Mr. Walter A. Keenan to sell to the State of South Carolina the Hair property, located at northeast corner of Main and Pendleton Streets, for the sum of \$50,000.00 was deferred.

Request of Mr. Harry O'B. Bellinger, Columbia City Engineer, for permission to use site known as "Cooter Pond", a portion of which is owned by the State, in carrying out its landfill garbage disposal program was granted.


Offer of Mr. W. Lonnie Bachman of West Columbia, to purchase at \$15.00 per acre land on south side of Highway known as Camp Styx property (approximately 669 acres) was declined.

The Director discussed plans for general renovation of Calhoun State Office Building and suggested that a committee from the Board be appointed to act with him. In this connection, the Chairman appointed Mr. Brown and Mr. Verner.

Mr. Leonard L. Long of Charleston, South Carolina, appeared before the Board in the interest of inquiring into the possibility of a development on Sullivans Island. The Director was instructed to visit Atlanta, Georgia, for the purpose of conferring with General Services Administration.

Offer of Mr. Robert M. Hollings of Charleston, to purchase Lot No. 29 Woodville, Christ Church Parish, Charleston County, for the sum of \$150.00 was presented and the Director was instructed to advertise for bids.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
