The Budget Commission met in the Governor's Office at 3:00 P. M. on December 8, 1949. All members of the Commission were present.

This meeting was attended by the State Penal Board and the Industrial Schools' Board, for discussion of the location of the proposed Industrial School for Negro Girls. Colonel Manning, Superintendent of the Penitentiary, was present. The Penal Board objected to the site chosen by the Industrial Schools' Board. Nothing definite was accomplished in connection with this matter.
