#### I. County / State Incidents

##### 1/25/2013:

On Friday 25 January there were many reports from Western and Northern Counties announcing closures of County offices as the result of adverse weather conditions. These counties and the closing times were; Oconee County 10:30 am, Pickens County 11:00 am, Spartanburg County noon, Laurens County 1:00 pm, Greenville County 2:00 pm, Cherokee County 2:30 pm, Lancaster and York Counties 3:00 pm, Union County Offices 3:15 pm, Chester County Offices at 3:30 pm and Fairfield County Offices 4:00 pm. Additional weather information, NWS Wilmington - Winter Weather Advisory cancelled at 10:34 pm.

##### 01/26/2013:

Reports for Saturday, Spartanburg County Landfill and Recycling Center will be operating on a two-hour delay, and the Spartanburg County Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse will be closed tomorrow.

Oconee County Government offices that are open on Saturday will be opening at 10:00 am

...A WINTRY MIX OF PRECIPITATION EXPECTED TODAY...

.A WEAK LOW PRESSURE SYSTEM WILL MOVE EAST FROM THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER VALLEY TODAY...SPREADING MOISTURE INTO THE SOUTHERN APPALACHIANS...FOOTHILLS AND WESTERN PIEDMONT THIS MORNING. THE PRECIPITATION...WHILE FAIRLY LIGHT IN MOST AREAS...WILL FALL INTO A COLD AND DRY AIRMASS. THIS WILL ALLOW A WINTRY MIX OF SNOW AND SLEET AT THE ONSET TO TRANSITION TO FREEZING RAIN FROM SOUTH TO NORTH THROUGH THE DAY. THE HEAVIEST ICING MAY OCCUR IN THE NORTHEAST GEORGIA MOUNTAINS WHERE SOUTHERLY UPSLOPE FLOW WILL LOCALLY ENHANCE PRECIPITATION AMOUNTS...AND ALSO NORTH OF THE BALSAMS AND ALONG THE BLUE RIDGE ACROSS THE MOUNTAINS FARTHER NORTH INTO THE COLD AIR. MAINLY LIGHT ACCUMULATIONS OF ICE ARE EXPECTED EAST OF THE MOUNTAINS... WITH PERHAPS A BIT MORE SLEET AND SNOW ALONG AND NORTH OF INTERSTATE 40. THE PRECIPITATION WILL TAPER OFF QUICKLY FROM THE WEST THIS EVENING.
