Hope this note finds everyone well. I wanted to share a few updates with you as a follow up from our meeting in Portland.

1. We will be working with Tony Garife and Fred McConnel to set up state team calls this month. We want to hear about the progress being made!
2. As you may recall, Oregon suggested to us that we reach out to AACC (American Association of Community Colleges) regarding the ACE (American Council on Education) approval of the NCRC for college credit. Tom Lindsley has been working on that since I shared that request with him in February after our Portland meeting. Below is a the most recent AACC newsletter with a nice mention of ACE's approval of the NCRC for college credit.
3. We are also completing the draft documents to help define our working relationship and support for the Round I CWRC states. We plan to send a draft for your review and comment next week.
4. We moved the NCRC State to National charts live on your state admin pages on the CWRC website. However, we are still in progress on working to provide you with the data on individuals who have taken three tests but have not earned a certificate. This data is a bit more complicated to set up. However, we are working on it and hope to have that report available to you this spring.
5. We are working through final steps on the CWRC survey plan. Thank you all for sending us your top survey questions. That feedback was most helpful.
6. We are working to bring on board our newest group of states this spring. I will be sure to share who they are when we complete the on boarding process.
7. And finally, a shout out to Jasper County, Missouri, for achieving their CWRC goals!

POLICY and ADVOCACY

1. PROGRESS ON FY 2013 FUNDING

Earlier this week, the House voted to keep the government funded through the end of the federal fiscal year. This took the form of passage of a full-year continuing appropriations resolution (CR) for FY 2013. The current CR that expires March 27. The House bill, [H.R. 933](#), provides detailed spending bills for the Departments of Defense, Military Construction and Veterans Affairs, shifting funds within these bills to priority programs to blunt the impact of sequestration. Funding for all other federal agencies and programs for FY 2013 remain largely at FY 2012 levels, less approximately 5% required by sequestration. The Budget Control Act of 2011 exempted several programs from sequestration, particularly Pell Grants, for FY 2013. Check the [Advocacy website](#) for updates.

2. SEQUESTRATION RESOURCES

While the full effects of sequestration will not be felt immediately, all nonexempt, nonsecurity federal projects, and activities for FY 2013 were subject to across-the-board cuts of approximately 5%. These cuts will impact numerous priority programs for community colleges and their students, including Work-Study, Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants, TRIO, GEAR UP, Titles III-A Strengthening Institutions and Developing Hispanic-Serving Institutions, as well as Perkins CTE, Adult Education, TAACCCT grants, and NSF- ATE grants.
