*Presenter Bios:*

Patty Barnett Mouton has served as the Vice President of Outreach & Advocacy for Alzheimer's Orange County since 2005. She manages clinical outreach and education for physicians, nurses, social workers and other health care providers, as well as the Advocacy and Public Policy activities at the local, state and federal levels. She is active in the Orange County Aging Services Collaborative and the Orange County Healthy Aging Initiative committee. Patty has served as co-chair of the Orange County Advance Care Planning Partners since 2010 and manages the Orange County Advance Care Planning Initiative. Ms. Mouton also currently facilitates Alzheimer's caregiver support groups at Our Lady Queen of Angels Church and St. Timothy Church. Ms. Mouton holds a BS in Human Services, a certificate in Fundamentals of Gerontology from USC, and a certificate in Palliative Care Chaplaincy from CSU San Marcos.

Daphne Johnston has been involved in senior administration for 15 years and currently leads the Respite Ministry in Montgomery, Alabama. The Respite Ministry serves over 200 people with Alzheimer's disease and dementia and includes 120 dementia trained volunteers from eight different churches and two synagogues. Ms. Johnston's volunteer model of care has drawn the attention of the University of Alabama's School of Medicine as they work to partner with other volunteer programs around the southeast United States. Ms. Johnston is an advocate for those living with memory loss and has made it her personal mission to help families, clergy and professionals better understand that trained volunteers can be the heart of community Alzheimer's programs. Ms. Johnston holds a bachelor's degree in sociology from Lagrange College and received her MA in Gerontology and Public Administration from the University of West Georgia.

  - b. The webinar will be broadcast via Adobe Acrobat Connect Pro. Adobe Connect requires the flash player and a high speed internet connection is recommended. Please visit the website [here](#) to test your system to ensure you are able to log on successfully to the event. Please check your computer prior to the webinar.
2. On the day of the webinar:
  - a. Enter the webinar using Internet Explorer or Firefox. These 2 programs are optimal for the webinar system we are using—Adobe Connect.
  - b. Log in 5 minutes prior to the event to ensure we can start on time. You will need to enter the email address used during the registration process to enter the webinar.
