NEW YORK (AP) — President-elect Donald Trump is offering former military intelligence chief Michael Flynn the national security adviser, elevating a fierce critic of current U.S. foreign policy into a crucial White House role. Flynn amounts to Trump's first signal to allies and adversaries about the course he could take in office.

[Justice Thomas calls conservatives to continue Scalia's work](#)

WASHINGTON (AP) — Supreme Court Justice Clarence Thomas says conservatives should make the work of the late Antonin Scalia a "prologue" in the effort to limit the power of the courts and other branches of government. The Supreme Court has too often granted rights to people that are not found in the Constitution, Thomas said, citing the decision in 2015 that made same-sex marriage legal across the country. Both Scalia and Thomas dissented from that decision.
