**Lower Waccamaw National Wildlife Refuge - South Carolina.** An additional 1,500 acres of this bird haven will extend efforts to preserve a vast ecosystem and also provide public recreation and learning opportunities.

**Pinhoti Trail - Georgia.** Saving this 1,015-acre strip of land will extend the Appalachian Trail from Maine down to Alabama, as proposed in 1925.

**Delaware Bay - Delaware.** Protection of this 430-acre wetland habitat will save an important waterfowl destination and wetland area in the Delaware Estuary, near a fast-growing development.
