

- WHEREAS,** South Carolina's statewide system of county alcohol and drug abuse authorities is committed to providing quality, ongoing treatment services for our citizens, representing our long-term commitment to addressing the problem of substance abuse in our communities; and
- WHEREAS,** the 2002 observance of "National Alcohol and Drug Addiction Recovery Month" provides a unique opportunity for the citizens of the Palmetto State to work together to help adolescents and adults with substance abuse problems lead healthier, happier, more productive lives.
