## Disaster Recovery Centers Open In Berkeley And Georgetown Counties To Help Hurricane Matthew Survivors

**COLUMBIA, S.C. –** Disaster recovery centers are now open in Georgetown and St. Stephen to help residents with damages and losses from Hurricane Matthew. The Berkeley and Georgetown County centers will be open Monday through Saturday until further notice.

Representatives from the South Carolina Emergency Management Division, the Federal Emergency

Management Agency, the U.S. Small Business Administration and other public and private agencies are at the center to explain disaster assistance programs and help survivors with applications for aid.

The disaster recovery centers are located at the following addresses:

### **Berkeley County**

10 AM to 6 PM, Saturday  
Closed Sunday

### **Georgetown County**

#### **Beck Recreation Center**

Georgetown, SC 29440  
9 AM to 7 PM, Monday- Friday  
10 AM to 6 PM, Saturday  
Closed Sunday

It is not necessary to visit a center to register for and receive state-federal disaster assistance. If possible, survivors should register with FEMA before visiting a recovery center.

To register go online any time to [DisasterAssistance.gov](https://DisasterAssistance.gov) or call the FEMA helpline at **800-621-3362**. Help is available in most languages, and phone lines are open 7:00 AM to 10:00 PM seven days a week until further notice.

Disaster survivors who are deaf, hard of hearing or have a speech disability and use a TTY may call **800-462-7585** to register. Those who use 711 or VRS (Video Relay Service) or require accommodations while visiting a center may call **800-621-3362**. All disaster recovery centers are accessible and equipped with tools to accommodate disaster survivors who need disability-related communication aids.

Federal and state disaster assistance for eligible individuals and families can include money for temporary rental assistance and essential home repairs for primary residences and help with other serious disaster-related losses not covered by insurance.

Low-interest disaster recovery loans from the U.S. Small Business Administration are the primary means of federal help for disaster survivors, including homeowners, renters and businesses of all sizes. Individuals and businesses should first register with FEMA. An application for an SBA disaster recovery loan may be completed online at <https://disasterloan.sba.gov/ela>. Additional disaster recovery centers will open soon in South Carolina counties affected by Hurricane Matthew.
