My wife and I file joint SC tax returns via paper and we pay via a paper check. My question is was our checking account information accessible via this cyber attack. One of the FAQ's you provided (I'll list it below) seemed to address that but when I contacted my bank about closing my checking account and opening a new one they said that information was not compromised and they really did not want to do that. Since I'm getting so I don't know who to believe any more I'm hoping you can provide more information. Below is the FAQ that seemed to address the above.

Q: What type of personal information may have been exposed?

A: While the investigation is still ongoing, South Carolina taxpayer's Social Security Numbers, debit card numbers, credit card numbers, and information that would be found on the front of a check like bank account and routing numbers may have been exposed
