The Queen hosted these students at the Penn Center on St. Helena Island and graciously extended the offer of service projects for us here on the park. In all, the students bagged 480 bags of oyster shells, which will be placed on an existing oyster reef to provide habitat for future generations of oysters during our next SCORE (SC Oyster Restoration and Enhancement Project) scheduled at Hunting Island's Russ Point landing on June 14th, 2012. The students also conducted beach sweeps and litter pick ups around the park and along the trails, bagging an estimated 50 bags of trash.
