APPROVAL OF AGENDA ITEMS

Motion made by Dr. Carolyn Prince, seconded by Ms. Corrie Plato, to approve the agenda as presented. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.

PRESENTATIONS

GIFT TO MS. VIRGINIA McCRAW – RETIREMENT FROM THE MARIAN WRIGHT EDELMAN PUBLIC LIBRARY

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Mr. Ron Munneryn, Chairman, asked Dr. Carolyn Prince and Mr. Ken Allen to come forward, as well as Ms. Virginia McCraw, so they could recognize Ms. McCraw for her years of service to Marlboro County. He stated that he had asked Dr. Prince to come forward since she had worked closely with Ms. McCraw, and Mr. Allen because Ms. Virginia resides in his district. Chairman Munneryn stated that Ms. McCraw served as Director of the Marian Wright Edelman Public Library and thanked her for her dedicated service. He also stated that she was a tough fighter for the new bookmobile which is finally becoming a reality. A clock was presented to Ms. McCraw by Marlboro County Council.

Dr. Carolyn Prince stated that she and Ms. McCraw worked together for some time at the School District and that Ms. McCraw assisted in the opening of the new library about five years ago. Dr. Prince stated that Ms. McCraw has worked very hard to provide projects that benefit citizens in our county of all ages and stated that the library is about much more than just books. Dr. Prince stated that Ms. McCraw also had our current Library Director as her intern. Dr. Prince thanked Ms. McCraw for all of the wonderful things she has done for citizens in our county and for all of the work with grant writing. She stated that she hoped that she would enjoy her retirement because she has earned it.

Councilman Ken Allen stated that he did not know of any other person who had worked so hard and that her efforts would be enjoyed by many for years to come. He wished Ms. McCraw the very best in her retirement.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

After approximately 10 minutes in executive session, a motion was made by Mr. Jason Steen, seconded by Mr. Anthony Woods, to leave executive session. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.

Chairman Munneryn stated that no votes were taken and no decisions were made.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES – April 14, 2015

Mr. Ron Munneryn, Chairman, asked if there were any comments on the minutes or suggested changes or additions. There were none.

Motion made by Dr. Carolyn Prince, seconded by Mr. Anthony Woods, to approve the minutes of April 14, 2015 as presented. Vote in favor: Mr. Ron Munneryn, Mr. Jason Steen, Dr. Carolyn Prince, Mr. Ken Allen, Mr. Willie Gladden, Mr. Steve Blackmon,

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and Mr. Anthony Woods. Abstain: Ms. Corrie Plato (not present at meeting). Vote: 7/0/1. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

ORDINANCE # 735 – AN ORDINANCE TO ADOPT THE ANNUAL BUDGET AND TO MAKE APPROPRIATIONS FOR MARLBORO COUNTY FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2015 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2016 – SECOND READING

Mr. Ron Munneryn, Chairman, stated that this was the second reading for this Ordinance. He recognized Mr. Jim Haynes, County Administrator, to make additional comments on this Ordinance.

Mr. Haynes stated that this Ordinance is being presented for a second reading of the budget for fiscal year 2015-2016 which was presented to members of Council earlier in the day. He stated that the public hearing will be held in June when Council will be asked to consider the third reading.

Chairman Munneryn thanked staff for their hard work and presentation of the proposed budget earlier in the day and asked if there were any questions or comments. There were none.

Motion made by Mr. Anthony Woods, seconded by Mr. Steve Blackmon, to approve the second reading of Ordinance # 735 – An Ordinance to adopt the annual budget and to make appropriations for Marlboro County for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015 and ending June 30, 2016. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.

ORDINANCE # 736 – AN ORDINANCE TO APPROVE THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN FOR MARLBORO COUNTY FOR THE PERIOD OF FY 2016-2020 – SECOND READING

Mr. Ron Munneryn, Chairman, stated that this was a second reading of this Ordinance. He recognized Mr. Jim Haynes, County Administrator, to make additional comments on this Ordinance.

Mr. Haynes stated that this Ordinance will approve an unfunded Capital Improvement Plan to reflect costs to include repairs to public buildings or construction of new buildings, airport expenses, and detention center improvements. We are not required to fund this plan, but we do have to have one in place.

Chairman Munneryn stated that members of Council heard from the Administrator at the budget work session as to how all of this works and asked if there were any questions or comments. There were none.

Motion made by Mr. Willie Gladden, seconded by Dr. Carolyn Prince, to approve the second reading of Ordinance # 736 – an Ordinance to approve the Capital Improvement Plan for Marlboro County for the period of FY 2016-2020. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.

ORDINANCE # 737 – AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING MARLBORO COUNTY TO CONTINUE AN AGREEMENT WITH THE MARLBORO COUNTY RESCUE SQUAD PROVIDING PARAMEDIC LEVEL EMERGENCY SERVICE AND TRANSFER SERVICE THROUGHOUT MARLBORO COUNTY – SECOND READING

Mr. Ron Munneryn, Chairman, recognized Mr. Jim Haynes, County Administrator, to make comments on this Ordinance.

Mr. Haynes stated that this Ordinance as presented would keep the agreement between Marlboro County and the Marlboro County Rescue Squad as it is currently for one year with an option for a two year renewal. Mr. Haynes stated that with the local hospital closing, Marlboro County Rescue Squad folks thought that there would not be any big changes but now that the hospital has closed, they are not so sure about how this will affect their services. The parties have agreed to renew for one year as the contract reads currently with an option to revisit and renegotiate or renew for an additional two years.

Chairman Munneryn stated that Council appreciates everything that the rescue folks do for us and it means a lot that they are willing to work with us.

Motion made by Mr. Ken Allen, seconded by Dr. Carolyn Prince, to approve the second reading of Ordinance # 737 – an Ordinance authorizing Marlboro County to continue an agreement with the Marlboro County Rescue Squad providing paramedic level emergency service and transfer service throughout Marlboro County. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

RESOLUTION # 05-15-01 – A RESOLUTION RATIFYING A MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT BETWEEN FLORENCE COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE AND THE MARLBORO COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE

Mr. Ron Munneryn, Chairman, recognized Mr. Jim Haynes, County Administrator, to make comments on this Resolution.

Mr. Haynes stated that the Mutual Aid Agreement was included behind the Resolution in the agenda packets and may be viewed in its entirety. He stated that counties often times enter into these types of agreements to assist one another in the case of an emergency. We have these types of agreements with other counties and would recommend approval.

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Motion made by Mr. Jason Steen, seconded by Ms. Corrie Plato, to approve Resolution # 05-15-01 – A Resolution ratifying a Mutual Aid Agreement Between the Florence County Sheriff's office and the Marlboro County Sheriff's office. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.

A PROCLAMATION FOR PEACE OFFICER'S MEMORIAL DAY – MAY 15, 2015

Mr. Ron Munnerlyn, Chairman, stated that this was a Proclamation for consideration designating May 15, 2015 as Peace Officer's Memorial Day in memory of all law enforcement officers who have lost their lives in the line of duty and would require that all flags on county buildings be flown at half-staff on May 15th. Chairman Munnerlyn asked if there were any questions or comments. There were none.

Motion made by Mr. Steve Blackmon, seconded by Mr. Ken Allen, to approve the Proclamation for Peace Officer's Day to be recognized on May 15, 2015. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.

A PROCLAMATION DESIGNATING THE SECOND FULL WEEK IN MAY AS MARLBORO COUNTY WOMEN'S LUNG HEALTH WEEK

Mr. Ron Munnerlyn, Chairman, stated that this Proclamation could be read in its entirety by viewing the agenda packet and stated that this Proclamation would designate the second full week in May as Marlboro County Women's Lung Health Week in order to encourage all residents of Marlboro County to learn more about the detection and treatment of lung cancer. He asked if there were any questions or comments. There were none.

Motion made by Mr. Jason Steen, seconded by Ms. Corrie Plato, to adopt Proclamation designating the second full week in May as Marlboro County Women's Lung Health Week. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.

DISCUSSION OF LOCAL HOSPITAL CLOSING

Mr. Ron Munnerlyn, Chairman, stated that our local hospital has now been closed as of Thursday, April 30, 2015. He stated that he was a member of a task force that has met in the last couple of weeks and the task force is concerned with helping any one facilitate a hospital here whether it is McLeod or Scotland. Chairman Munnerlyn stated that people are concerned and anxious and he understood that, but stated that those hospitals have done a study to consider the market place in this community to see if they could operate it. He stated that this was a business decision for these folks and with that being said that McLeod and Scotland have stated that they cannot lose money and put at risk their other rural facilities. Chairman Munnerlyn stated that with that being said, he had asked Mr. Jim Haynes, County Administrator, to review the history of Marlboro Park Hospital.

Mr. Jim Haynes stated that he had researched the history of Marlboro Park Hospital and found that Marlboro General Hospital began as a not-for-profit company, which was a

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locally controlled facility. According to the plaque on the front door of the Administration office building, the facility was dedicated in 1929 by the people of Marlboro County with assistance from the Duke Endowment until 1984. Mr. Haynes stated that in 1984 the not-for-profit was sold to a for-profit company, Hospital Corporation of America and then subsequently sold to CHS in 2008.

Mr. Haynes stated that his findings noted that proceeds from the original sale were placed in a trust called Marlboro County General Hospital Charity, which filings now show total assets of over \$7,000,000.00. This charity was never an organization that was controlled by Marlboro County Council. He stated that the current officers of the Charity were Jane Rogers, Chair; Barry Avent, Vice-Chair; Joe Breeden, Treasurer; and Rhett Covington, Secretary.

Mr. Haynes stated that he found two 990 filings on two companies, one being the Marlboro County General Hospital Charity which has over \$7,000,000.00 in assets and list local Bennettsville addresses for contacts. The other, Marlboro General Hospital reflected that it had assets of more than \$4,000,000.00 and stated that he was unsure if these two are related in any way.

Mr. Haynes stated that Marlboro County Council was not involved in the sale of the Marlboro General Hospital in any way, nor did Council receive any funds from the sale. He stated that grants were made by the Marlboro County General Hospital Charity to Marlboro County General Hospital, Scotland County Hospital, Frances Marion University Nurses Scholarships, and McLeod Health Foundation. He stated that the other charity made similar grants to Northeastern Technical College, Richmond Community College, MGH Emergency Relief Fund, Pee Dee Red Cross, and McLeod Health Foundation.

Mr. Haynes stated that again none of this was approved by the County Council in any way and this has been confirmed with the Charity Foundation. He stated that any contributions made by the Charity must be made on behalf and for the benefit of Marlboro County citizens.

Chairman Munnerlyn stated that the county has no control of the hospital. He stated that the monies from the sale of the old Marlboro General Hospital are being properly used but the law tells them how and for what purpose they may use these funds. Chairman Munnerlyn stated that he felt that money and resources could certainly influence decisions about a medical facility here and that Marlboro County Council will do whatever it can to help keep a facility open here in Marlboro County. He stated that Council had met in Executive Session and would consider taking action to donate the old Winn-Dixie building and site to a qualified medical provider to operate a stand along facility or a mini hospital on the condition that it be a not-for-profit operation. Chairman Munnerlyn also stated that the Hospital foundation has agreed to upgrade the facility and that this has been confirmed in writing in a letter to the Editor which has been sent to the local paper.

Chairman Munnerlyn asked if there were any questions or comments and there were none.

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Motion made by Dr. Carolyn Prince, seconded by Mr. Jason Steen, to donate the Winn-Dixie building and site to a qualified medical provider for the purpose of operating a stand-alone emergency room or a new hospital, with one of the requirements being that the qualified medical provider must be a not-for-profit operation. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.

Dr. Carolyn Prince asked that the history of Marlboro Park Hospital be printed in the paper since the sale of the Marlboro General occurred more than 30 years ago and did not involve Marlboro County Council.

Chairman Munnerlyn stated that was a good idea because people in the community are very upset that we now no longer have a hospital.

Chairman Munnerlyn asked if there were any additional comments or questions. There were none.

APPOINTMENT TO BOARDS & COMMISSIONS

Mr. Ron Munnerlyn, Chairman, opened the floor for any appointments to Boards and Commissions.

Motion made by Mr. Anthony Woods, seconded by Ms. Corrie Plato, to appoint Mr. Griffin Driggers to the Planning Commission to represent District 8. Vote in favor. Unanimous. Motion carried.

FINANCE DEPARTMENT – MS. AINSLEY A. MOORE

Ms. Ainsley Moore, Finance Director, reported due to the change in the meeting schedule, she was unable to give a report on revenue and expenses for the month of April due to their not receiving all of the appropriate bank statements needed to reconcile April's postings. She stated that once all verifications have been received, she would provide members of Council with reports on expenses and revenue as of the end of April.

Ms. Moore stated that the Senate is scheduled to begin discussing the budget today. She stated that the Senate Finance Committee provided no increase in the Local Government Fund and that the LGF mirrors' the House version of the budget remaining at \$212,000,000.00 with \$12,500,000.00 of the total being funded with nonrecurring, or one time, revenue. She stated that she would continue to monitor legislation on the LGF issue.

Ms. Moore asked if there were any questions or comments. There were none.

Chairman Munnerlyn thanked Ms. Moore for her report and for all of staff's hard work on the budget.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT – MR. JIM HAYNES, COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR

Mr. Jim Haynes stated that he first wanted to thank Ms. Ainsley Moore for the numerous hours spend in putting the numbers of the proposed budget together. He stated that she had spent double duty and he very much appreciated her help with all of this as she continued to meet his various demands for responses on other things.

Mr. Haynes also stated that he had received a 34 page letter from the SC Department of Health and Human Services about a number of deficiencies. He stated that the county currently provides and maintains the buildings which house the Health Department, Department of Social Services, and other facilities. He stated that the buildings have problems with one of them being they still have the original roofs on them and the buildings were built back in the late 70s. Mr. Haynes stated that he had requested a priority list from two different departments but has not yet received these lists. He promised that he would have staff begin the basic cleaning and maintenance.

Dr. Carolyn Prince stated that once requests like these are received that staff should get an estimate of the costs and sends the estimate to the Legislative Delegation and let them know that we cannot afford to make the needed repairs.

Mr. Haynes stated that he understood this and stated that he tried to explain to the folks when he met with them problems with the funding of the Local Government Fund. He stated that no one really wants to hear this.

Chairman Munnerlyn stated that staff received a letter from Senator Gerald Malloy some time ago after we forwarded to them our PARD Grant application and stated that it was because of Senator Malloy that it was not signed. Chairman Munnerlyn stated that these funds in the amount of \$50,000.00 will wind up going to another county because of politics and stated that he was very disappointed about this.

Mr. Willie Gladden stated that he had talked with Representative Patricia Henegan and she advised him that a meeting had been scheduled with Senator Malloy on May 5 to discuss this and other things.

Chairman Munnerlyn stated that we would hope for the best and see what happens.

Recognition of Employees – The following employees are recognized with five or more years of service to Marlboro County through the month April: Teresa Burgess (12 years); Christopher Byers (10 years); Clara Cloer (17 years); Lewis Cooper (19 years); Arthur Hamer (16 years); Warren McColl (8 years); Curtiss McDuffie (17 years); Sharon Thomas (9 years); and Ann White (17 years).

Notice of Drafting for Amendments to Solid Waste Management - Staff received a Notice of Drafting for amendments to R.61-107.279, Solid Waste Management: Used Oil.

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The Department is proposing to amend R.61-107.279 by removing the requirement for used oil marketers to obtain a permit as specified in Subpart H, Section 297.73, as well as other changes. Interested persons may submit their comments in writing to Jana White at the S.C. Department of Health and Environmental Control, Bureau of Land and Waste Management, 2600 Bull Street, Columbia, SC 29201 or to whitejm@dhec.sc.gov not later than May 26, 2015 at 5:00 p.m.

Foreclosure Action naming Marlboro County as Defendant – Staff received notice of a foreclosure action in which Marlboro County Clerk of Court has been included as a named defendant. The action was brought by Green Tree Servicing, LLC against Randy and Crystal Johnson and Marlboro County Clerk of Court for the failure to pay payments as promised. The Marlboro County Clerk of Court's office was listed as a Defendant because of a restitution judgment filed of record which predates the mortgage. Our County Attorney, Harry Easterling, Jr., has stated that he can push the issue but the amount of the restitution judgment is less than \$1,000.00 and may not be due to the County per se. The county attorney stated that he thought the defendants have left the county so after they lose the house, he believes there will be little leverage to collect this debt.

Dogs -. Stated that there had been two folks bitten by pitt bulls. One victim was bitten on the left hand which did not require any medical attention, but the other victim was bitten on his right leg and received treatment from McLeod Medical Center in Florence, SC. One of the victims shot one dog and killed him due to the attack. The other dog has been quarantined by the Humane Society and DHEC has been notified.

SCAC 2015 Board of Directors Scholarship - Staff has received notification from the SC Association of Counties that Ms. Susan S. Boyd, who attends Marlboro County High School, was chosen as the recipient of the SCAC's 2015 Board of Directors Scholarship. Ms. Boyd is the daughter of Coach Dean and Leigh Boyd. An award ceremony will be held at the Marlboro County High School Awards ceremony on Tuesday, May 26, and Chairman Munnerlyn has been asked to make the presentation to Ms. Boyd on behalf of the SC Association of Counties.

PARD Application - Staff is working with our Legislators to determine why we have yet to receive any word on our PARD application that was signed by (then) Representative Munnerlyn in November of 2014. This application was for just under \$50,000.00 and was to begin the upgrades and renovations of the old Blenheim Gym.

Morgue Needs - Staff advised that due to the closing of Marlboro Park Hospital, it has had to make plans for the use of another county's morgue. Previously the Coroner had used the Hospital morgue, but he has been notified that it will no longer be available.

Electric Vehicle Charging Station – Staff is beginning the process of installing an electric vehicle charging station in the new parking lot. This station may really be for the folks who may pass through our county and be in need of a vehicle charge. The County will be listed

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on websites used by the electric vehicle owners and may at least represent a bit of positive publicity.

Landscaping at the Administration office - Adams Landscaping will be handling the landscaping at the Administration offices and this is expected to begin around mid-May. It is estimated to take approximately one month to complete.

2015 National Day of Prayer Gathering - Please be reminded that the 2015 National Day of Prayer Gathering will be held on the courthouse lawn on Thursday, May 7, 2015 beginning at 5:45 p.m.

CPR and AED Training - CPR and AED training sessions have been scheduled for May 11-14 and May 18-21, 2015 for all county employees who wish to participate. All employees are encouraged to participate in this training but it is certainly not mandatory. The training will consist of one day and there are eight days from which to choose. The training will be held at the Marlboro County Rescue Squad hut on Ballpark Street and will begin each day on the dates above at 9:00 a.m. If any of you here would like to participate, please contact Ms. Patricia Bundy so that she can schedule a date for you. The instructors have asked that we limit each session to about 12 participants.

NACo Annual Conference - The NACo's 80th Annual Conference is scheduled for July 10-13, 2015 at the Charlotte Convention Center. Please let Ms. Patricia Bundy know if you plan to attend so that she may assist with your registration and reservations.

SCAC's 48th Annual Conference - The SCAC's 48th Annual Conference will be held at Hilton Head from August 1-5, 2015. Please let Ms. Patricia Bundy know if you plan to attend so that the appropriate reservations may be made for you.

RECOGNITION OF CITIZEN'S REQUEST BEFORE COUNCIL

No citizens signed up to speak.

RECOGNITION OF COUNCIL MEMBERS

Anthony Woods – stated that he hoped to have some good news to report at the next Council meeting but until then he would keep things to himself. He reported that all was good in Clio.

Corrie Plato – No comments.

Jason Steen – stated that he had received several complaints about the trash trucks and how that they are trashing up our roads. He stated that the county works hard to keep our roads clean and for these folks to let trash fly out of their trucks was a huge problem. He stated that he had talked with Mr. Haynes about this and hopes to get this looked into.

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Mr. Steen stated that the PARD grant application should have been signed and stated that if it is signed at this late date that it would place a hardship on our folks to get it done.

Dr. Carolyn Prince – stated that she would like to echo what has been stated about the PARD grant application situation and stated that she would be calling Representative Patricia Henegan about this tomorrow.

Dr. Prince stated that the county should work on getting a morgue of its own. She stated that in cases of homicide the chain of command is crucial and we needed to have control of that. She stated that staff set up a meeting with the Coroner to look at space at the Justice Complex in having a morgue there. She stated that it was nice that other counties have offered assistance to us but that we needed our own and did not need to depend upon another county for this service. She did state that she appreciated the fact that something had been worked out temporarily.

Dr. Prince stated that she hoped that the foundation will want to work with the county to provide a medical emergency care center to our citizens. She stated that everyone should stay well.

Steve Blackmon – thanked all who have worked on the PARD grant application and all efforts in this regard. He stated that he hoped that the ones that could make the decision on this would do the right thing. He stated that there was no reason that they should not. He stated that Blenheim has been waiting for a long time and that it was time for something to be done.

Ken Allen – supports Council's position on the PARD grant application. He stated that the delegation was showing pettiness and it just wasn't right.

Willie Gladden – stated that he talked with Dana Moore about the annual turkey giveaway since the Piggly Wiggly has closed. He stated that a group would be meeting in September to try to keep this going. He stated that there were others that contributed products to this project such as Pepsi and he hoped that they could keep it going.

Mr. Gladden stated that he really would like for staff to check into the county being able to tax independent contractors who reside and conduct business in the county. He stated that the City does this and brings in revenue. He stated that the county should be able to do this as well.

Mr. Gladden stated that staff should look at the Detention Center and the monies received from the canteen to see how they are being handled and spent.

Mr. Gladden stated that our roads were becoming an issue. He stated that 4 ½ miles from U-Tot'Em to Adamsville Road, there are dirt roads and gravel roads down there with major problems and we cannot do anything about them. He stated that this was a problem.

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Chairman Munnerlyn stated that the County Transportation Committee has public meetings from time to time and they advertise these in the paper. He stated that these citizens should appear at the meetings and voice their concerns.

Chairman Munnerlyn asked Mr. Jim Haynes, County Administrator, and Ms. Patricia Bundy, Clerk to Council, to work on setting up the Recreation Ad-Hoc committee meeting for Monday, May 18, 2015 at 6:00 p.m.

No items were heard.


ADJOURN


