On behalf of our member community health centers, I am requesting that the reimbursement methodology as described herein be utilized to distribute the state appropriation of \$700,000. The allocation methodology is based on the percentage derived from the total number of uninsured patients served by each health center compared to the total number of uninsured patients served by all centers in calendar year 2008.

Enclosed for your reference is the spreadsheet, which was previously sent to Mr. Saxon, that uses the allocation formula. Also enclosed are the appropriation request to the General Assembly and corresponding language from the Legislature.

If further clarification or information is needed, please let me know. I would also like to provide health center directors an estimate date when they can expect disbursement of these funds along with the process in requesting them. Please advise.

The South Carolina Primary Health Care Association (SCPHCA), on behalf of the Nurses, Registered Dietitians, Health Centers (RHCs) that serve medically underserved patients throughout South Carolina, is pleased for the Governor's equitable appropriation of \$1.1 million for the current fiscal year.

For the upcoming fiscal year the SCPHCA respectfully requests a \$2 million recurring budget appropriation to DHHS for the purpose of formula-determined allocations to RHCs to improve access to preventive and primary health care services for uninsured patients.

Of the total, \$2 million shall be allocated by DHHS to RHCs based on the proportion of uninsured patients served during the prior reporting period by each RHC relative to the total uninsured patients served by all RHCs.

\$1 million shall be divided and allocated by DHHS in equal amounts to each RHC for capital or operational expenditures that build capacity to treat uninsured patients.

90.12. (SR: Health and Human Services Funding) The source of funds appropriated in this provision is \$98,467,983 of Department of Health and Human Services general fund appropriations, carry forward funds and earmarked and restricted special revenue fund accounts.

Of these funds, the department is directed to disburse the following Department of Health and Human Services appropriations for the purposes stated:

Dear Ms. Woodard:

Thank you for your letter of March 17, 2009 regarding a proposed change in methodology for the distribution of the \$700,000 appropriation for Federally Qualified Community Health Centers (FQHC) in Proviso 90.12 in the FY 2008-2009 Appropriations Act.

It is our understanding that you have proposed that the funding be allocated based on the total number of uninsured patients served by each FQHC rather than the current methodology which is based on the increase in the number of uninsured patients served by each FQHC. As you know, the current methodology was communicated to DHHS by Senate Finance Committee staff in previous years. Therefore, since there is no instructive language in the proviso that directs DHHS to change the methodology for FY 2009, we had to inquire as to whether the legislative intent had changed.

Based on our discussion with Senate Finance Committee staff, it is our understanding that the legislative intent has not changed and that we are expected to allocate the funds for FY 2009 based on the current methodology. Therefore we cannot approve your request to change the allocation methodology at this time, and we will be calculating the allocations to FQHC's using the current methodology, based on the increase in uninsured patients.

We appreciate the services that FQHC's provide to both Medicaid and uninsured patients. If you have any questions about the allocations please contact Jeff Saxon or Debbie Strait.
