

Columbia, South Carolina
September 11, 1947

The Budget Commission met in the Governor's office at 4:30 P.M. on September 11th, 1947. Governor Thurmond and Mr. Flowden were present at this meeting. Senator Brown was absent. It was agreed that any action taken at this meeting would be subject to later approval by Senator Brown.

The following transfers of appropriations were approved:

<u>The S C Library Board</u>	
Motor Vehicles & Equipment	\$ 450.00 To - Salaries - Field Service Librarian

<u>State Electrician</u>	
Freight Express & Deliveries	25.00 To - Office Supplies

The following allotments were granted from the Civil Contingent Fund:

<u>C. G. Shockley Construction Co</u>	
Alterations in the Governor's Office	\$3,444.11

Mr. Christie Benet and Dr. B. O. Whitten appeared before the Commission with a request that funds be provided by the Budget Commission to construct a pipe line to connect the State Training School with the City of Clinton water supply. It was explained to the Commission that the shortage of water at this school was so acute that an increased supply was an immediate necessity. It was also explained that provision for this line had been included in the construction bill for State institutions which had not, however, been approved by the Governor, and that in the event of the Governor's approval of this bill, any funds advanced by the Budget Commission would be returned. The Budget Commission agreed to supply funds for this improvement from the Civil Contingent Fund if, and when, needed.

Salary changes were approved at the following institutions:

The State Training School
Clemson College
S. C. Aeronautics Commission
State Board of Health

The Commission declined to transfer funds from approved accounts of the

Senate to the fund for installing elevators in the State House for the purpose of employing guards of the Treasurer's office during the installation, on the grounds that such guarding should be done by regular watchmen employed by the Commission on State House and Grounds.

All of the above matters were subsequently approved by Senator Brown.

The Commission then adjourned.
